Authority

President's U.S. Ocean Action Plan, issued, December 17, 2004, "Supporting Marine Transportation."

PURPOSE

"To create a partnership of Federal agencies with responsibility for the Marine Transportation System (MTS) - <u>waterways</u>, <u>ports and their intermodal connections</u> – to ensure the development and implementation of national MTS policies consistent with national needs." [CMTS Charter]

Modernize heights and implement real-time water level and current observing systems...

Response:

- National Strategy calls to deliver timely, relevant accurate navigation safety information to mariners, including real time information systems such as [PORTS]...real time current velocity systems and those systems associated with development of [IOOS]...
- Navigation Tech IAT to coordinate real-time observations with others such as AIS to enhance information provided to the mariner.

Strengthen NOAA's nav services emergency response and recovery capabilities...

Response:

- National Strategy recommends enhancing and improving existing frameworks to mitigate risks to vessels and environment and respond to accidents and natural disasters.
- Emerging issues proposed by the VADM and Admiral Allen requesting CMTS engagement on response. Not yet formulated.
