# JAMES BALDWIN (1924 - 1987)

was an author and activist from New York City.

He began using LGBTQ characters in his work, long before any Pride movement took form. His protagonists are often gay or bisexual black men, who face internal and external struggle in their search for social- and self-acceptance. These themes are apparent in his groundbreaking novel, "Giovanni's Room". The message he wished to convey was to choose love, no matter the recipient, and he resisted gender-related labels.

As an activist for Civil Rights, Baldwin also gave lectures around the country on racial inequality. He interviewed people in the American South and wrote essays on domestic racism that would appear in magazines like The New York Times. Through his writings and plays, he pushed for political movements toward social change in midtwentieth-century America.
