S-M362-FA-19, F/V Relentless Search

Recap

- 28-30 OCT: FA port call, moored starboard side to the pier at Pier 30/32, San Francisco, CA.
- 31 OCT: The ship is moored starboard side to the pier at Pier 30-32, San Francisco, CA. M/V/C/S for getting underway, transiting Gulf of the Farallones, conducting ship survey operations on project S-M362-FA-19, H13334, search for *F/V Relentless*, western San Francisco TSS.
- 1 NOV: The ship is underway, in the Gulf of the Farallones, on project S-M362-FA-19, approximately 6 NM S of SE Farallon Island, search for *F/V Relentless*, steering full coverage. Commenced fire and abandon ship drills.
- 2 NOV: Underway conducting survey operations on project S-M362-FA-19, H13334, search for *F/V Relentless*. FA commenced transiting the North Pacific Ocean to H13335, SW of Trinidad Head, CA, EXPRESS survey working grounds.



Looking Forward

- 3-6 NOV: survey operations on project S-M362-FA-19 continue, with EXPRESS and the Stonewall Bank surveys.
 - 7-8 NOV: FA transits to Pier 90/91, Seattle, WA, for winter repairs.

- The *R/V Ocean Explorer* surveyed for three partial days mid-week as weather conditions allowed, collecting data in Survey H13318.

- Weather permitting, the *R/V Ocean Explorer* will continue to work in H13318 before moving to H13319.
 - *R/V H. F. Stout* is expected to resume operations in sheet H13313 over the coming days.

Recap

- The *M/V Atlantic Surveyor* continued survey on Sheet 1 (H13295).
- We encountered severe weather over Thursday Oct 30 into Friday Nov 1 which forced us to the dock in Cape Charles, VA.
- We returned to survey late afternoon on Nov 1 and had to stand down again due to weather early Sunday morning.
- Total target 5553 LNM. To date, 16.63% of the survey data are acquired, at 923 LNM.

Looking Forward

- Continue survey on Sheet 1 (H13295).
 - The weather forecast is calling for improved weather through Thursday night.
 - A scheduled port call will take place on Friday Nov 8, 2019.

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OER-KR-19-01, Florida-Georgia, Vicinity of Blake Plateau

Recap

- Between 27 October 2019 and 2 November 2019, *Fugro Brasilis* acquired 882.40 LNM of full coverage multibeam, sub-bottom profiler data, 2 CTD casts, and 23 XBTs within the survey limits of Area 1.

Looking Forward

- *Fugro Brasilis* will continue survey operations in Area 1A. Then, a deep/very deep-water normalization dataset will be acquired and analysed before commencing survey operations in Area 1B.
