Recap

- Last week we had a very productive start of the week and were able to complete the southern half of the Sheet 8 mainscheme lines and majority of fill until weather set in.
- The coverage map only reflects acquisition through 11/21/19 due to a POSPac licensing issue aboard the *Blake*, but all mainscheme lines have been completed, which will be reflected in our next coverage update. Earlier in the week the *Blake* was able to run multibeam investigations on H13261, H13262, H13263, H13264, H13265, and H13266. The *Blake* returned to port on 11/23 due to weather.

Looking Forward

- We plan to stop acquisition while we compile a final fill and investigation plan needed to wrap up the project.
- The week of December 9th we plan to complete all outstanding fill, investigations and remaining bottom samples to wrap up the project.

Recap

- The R/V H.F. Stout surveyed in H13313 for the first half of the week.
- The *R/V Ocean Explorer* began the week in H13314 and moved to H13319 mid-week.
- Both boats were on weather in the latter part of the week.

Looking Forward

• The weather forecast for the coming week is mostly unfavorable. Consequently, both boat crews will be standing down and will resume survey with the next favorable forecast.

Recap

- The *M/V Atlantic Surveyor* continued survey on Sheet 3 (H13302), while gaps and item surveys are being created for Sheet 1 (H13295).
- We encountered weather delays on November 17, and first part of November 18, 2019.
- We returned to survey during Nov 18, and broke from survey November 19 for a very brief "touch-and-go" partial crew exchange in the port of Cape Charles, VA. We returned to survey on the same day.
- Total target 5553 LNM. To date, 52% of the survey data are acquired, at 2889 LNM.

Looking Forward

- Continue survey on Sheet 3 (H13302).
- Port call and temporary suspension of survey operations on November 26, 2019 over the Thanksgiving Holiday.
- Return to survey operation on Sheet 3 (H13302) and Sheet 1 (H13295) on December 2, 2019.

- The GO Liberty is demobilized.
- The *Pelagos* conducted in-fills on November 17, 2019, on stand-by awaiting additional in-fills.

- Upon completion the field office will be demobilized, and the vessel will be packed and stored in Port St. Joe.
