



# MARY JACKSON

(1921-2005)

was a **mathematician**, and NASA's first Black female engineer.

Jackson was one of a small group of African American women who worked as aeronautical engineers, called "human computers," at NASA during the Space Age.

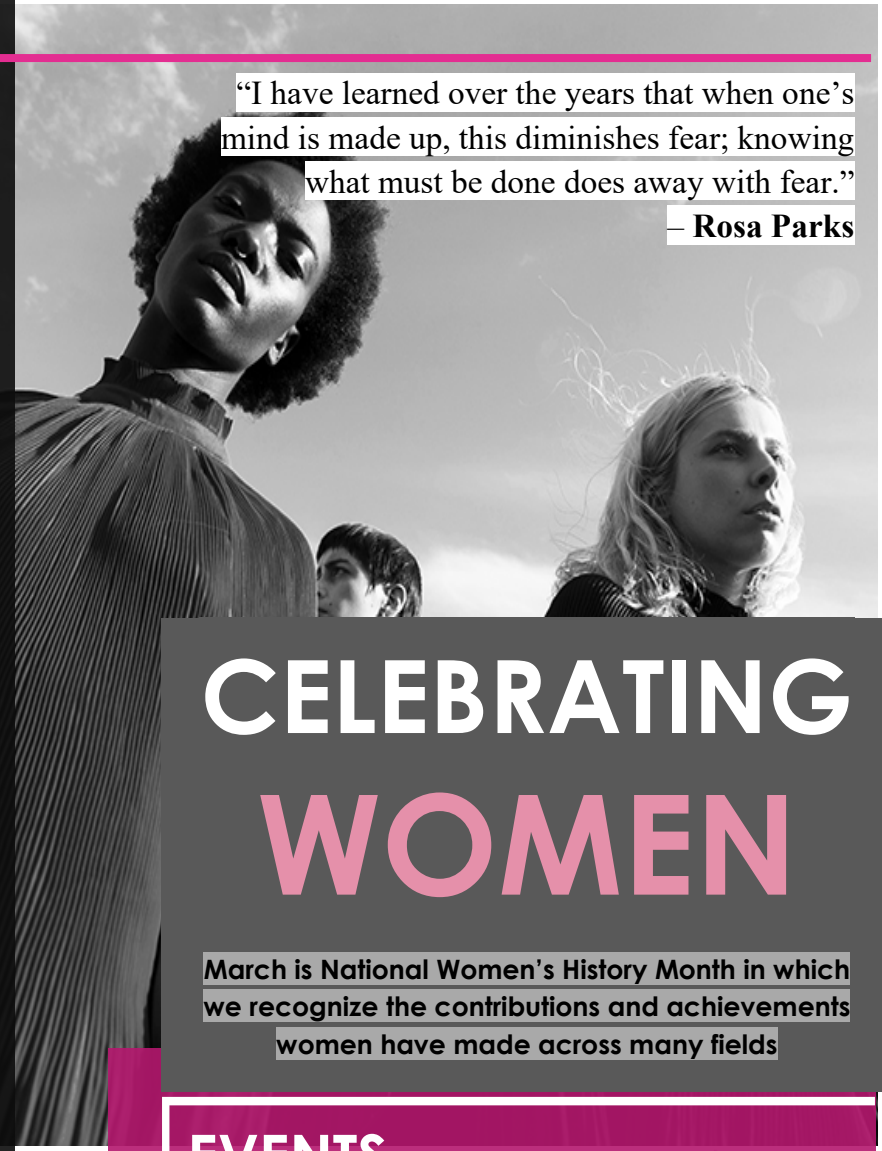
She later moved on to be a human resources administrator, where she helped other women and minorities advance their careers.

The story of her pioneering contributions to NASA was later dramatized in the 2016 film *Hidden Figures*.
